





NATO SUMMIT: 4 DECEMBER

Thank you for your letter of 24 November about the programme for the NATO Summit. I agree generally with what is proposed. I do not think the Prime Minister will want to fly to Brussels on Sunday evening unless the weather forecast nearer the time is very bad. The Prime Minister will wish to give her press conference as soon as the meeting ends, even if this overlaps with those given by the Secretary General and President Bush. I note that your letter refers to FCO officials travelling with the Foreign Secretary. I assume this refers only to a Private Secretary and support staff. 
PRESIDENT BUSH'S BRIEFING FOR NATO GOVERNMENTS ON 4 DECEMBER

I understand that it has been agreed that President Bush will brief NATO governments on the morning of 4 December in Brussels on his meeting with President Gorbachev. The Prime Minister proposes to attend.
